WHEREAS; cardiovascular disease claims the lives of nearly 420,000 American women each year, approximately one death per minute;

WHEREAS, nearly as many women die of heart disease, stroke, and all other cardiovascular disease than the next four leading causes of death combined, including all cancers;

WHEREAS; February is designated as American Heart Month, and February 3, 2017 will mark the 14th Anniversary Celebration of "National Wear Red Day for Women;"




WHEREAS, making the right choices relating to proper nutrition, physical activity, and other healthy life-style choices are essential to living a heart healthy life; and
