



SPOTSWOOD MAYOR ED SEELY NAMED HONORARY PIG MASTER OF ST. PETER'S ANNUAL COMMUNITY PIG ROAST

SPOTSWOOD, NJ, August 28, 2017 -- St. Peter's Episcopal Church has named Spotswood Mayor Ed Seely as the First Honorary Pig Master for its fourth annual Community Pig Roast. The family-fun event will be held **Saturday, September 16 from 4 to 7pm** at the historical Church Grounds, located at the intersection of Main Street and DeVoe Avenue in Spotswood. Proceeds from the Pig Roast will benefit St. Peter's, one of New Jersey's oldest, continuously operating faith communities and its extensive charitable work in the greater Spotswood area including the popular Wednesday Night Community Suppers, outreach garden, Alice's CUP food pantry and Thrift Shop.
